



- Proclamation of indenpendence of Montenegro
- 28 May 2008 the date when IPOM started officially
 Official Gazette of Montenegro, No. 30/2008 -
- Independent body within Montenegrin public administration, dealing with registration of industrial property rights and depositing copyright and related rights
- IPOM work is supervised by the Ministry of Economy of Montenegro










Improving Montenegrin IPR legislation:

- Montenegro is a signatory to 19 treaties
- Montenegro is a member of 13 WIPO bodies

Regular and intensive cooperation with WIPO and EPO through:





Formal intellectual property rights



The holders of the IPRs are formally provided to possess their property and control its use

MONTENEGRIN INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY GAZETTE

- Article 12 of Paris Convention on protection of intellectual property prescribes that each state signatory to the Convention is obliged to 'issue one periodical".
- Publishing all relevant information prescribed by laws and rules, such as:
 - Information from the procedure of granting industrial property right;
 - Information on granted rights ;
 - Information on later changes in regard with the granted rights.
- Official information:
 - Introduction by the Director of the Office;
 - Informant: international cooperation, author's texts written by the advisers; tables; reports; views ...



"Intellectual property rights seem to be only words which do not manage to cause any excitement. 34 requests for protection of the IPRs



Intellectual property at Universities:

- University of Montenegro, Faculty of Law, Podgorica Civit Arry (II year of studies) "Intellectual property"
- University of Montenegro, Academy of Theatre, Cetinje, Department for production (post-graduate studies, I semester) "Copyright and intellectual property"
- Private University "Mediterean", Faculty of Law, Podgorica, Copyright (not compulsory)



- Intellectual property is insufficiently present in the Universities of Montenegro
- due to lack of interest and lack of funds
- there are some individual activities undertaken by the Professors (working on their own inventions and regsitering patents)
- private University "Mediterean" shows interest
- National IP strategy does not cover any enhancement in this area (because of the demand for improvement of the enforcement system)
- Research & development activities are covered & fostered by the Ministry of Science
- There are no companies in Montenegro focused on promoting inventions



Case from practice:

Competition for co-financing of scientific research activities in 2012, amounting to EUR 300,000.

- ✤Issued by : Ministry of Science of Montenegro;
- ✤13 categories (... Promotion and co-financing patents ... Publishment of scientific works ...)
- Follow up activities and exchange of information ...





- Tasks of Adviser in the Office:
 - Seminars; Trainings; Workshops; Courses; Prezentatations; Fairs
- Process of building a sustainable IPR protection system connecnted appropriately with the first step – provision of specialistic knowledge, and subsequent konowledge transfer.
- Necessary to establish efficient coordination mechanisms and thus intensify the activities aimed to raising awareness of the importance of intellectual property.





NATIONAL IP STRATEGY

National Intellectual Property Strategy for the period from 2012 to 2015

- ✤ Cooperation with WIPO experts.
- Objective: to raise awareness of intellectual property among IPR actors competent for enforcement of IPR policy, and among potential users as well.






NATIONAL IP STRATEGY

Challenges:

Need for dedicated human resources who combine: advocacy and organizational interventions



- Planned activities of the IPOM regarding transfer of knowledge:
 - Improve cooperation among institutions
 - Trainings preparing staff for qualitative and efficient execution of their tasks & duties
 - Provide better means & conditions for supporting the employees in their daily work
 - Further work on improving data bases in order to make them available & accessible to the public
