

Guidelines (Mission)

The Platform facilitates the interaction between the Western Balkan Countries, the EU member states, the candidate and potential candidate countries and other states associated to the Framework Programmes for RTD and the European Commission. Its main objective is to support the enhanced integration of the WBCs in the European Research Area. It is a strategic body to deal with European, multilateral and regional issues of Science and Technology policies in and with the WBCs. It acts as an information exchange centre, clearing house for joint ideas and activities, and coordination forum for needs, suggestions and proposals of the WBCs to the European Commission, the EU27, Candidate and Potential Countries and the countries associated to FP7 (AC) and vice versa. In this spirit, the Platform continues and intensifies the progress achieved under the EU-Balkan Countries Action Plan on Science and Technology.

Scope of the Platform

- With a view to promoting the implementation and development of European research cooperation and thereby also supporting the technological and economic development in the Western Balkan Countries, the Platform will:
- Act as a forum for exchanging information and views, elaborating recommendations on the RTD policy, and coordinating needs, suggestions and proposals in and towards the WBCs, especially regarding the Framework Programmes;
- Monitor RTD policies and developments including interactions with innovation and higher education, and intervene with specific recommendations, if deemed necessary;
- **Propose concrete actions** to be taken in the context of furthering the EU-WBC cooperation on RTD and the bi- and multilateral cooperation activities;
- Identify issues of mutual importance to be addressed in the context of the Platform; and,
- Seek synergies with other instruments, organisations and stakeholders to strengthen the research capacity in the Western Balkan countries.


Conclusions of meeting of Steering Platform on Research for Western Balkan Countries Ohrid, 26 May 2011

The Steering Platform on Research for the Western Balkan Countries met in Ohrid on 26 May 2011. The meeting was co-chaired by the Hungarian Presidency of the Council of the European Union, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia on behalf of the Western Balkan Countries — who hosted the event — and the European Commission.


The Platform welcomed the presentation from RCC and the Worldbank outlining the preliminary ideas on how to implement the project "Regional Strategy on Research and Development for Innovation for Western Balkans" on the basis of the Joint Statement of the Ministerial Conference held in April 2009 in Sarajevo. The need to mobilize knowledge and create more leverage was underlined and the importance to build upon work already undertaken, in particular by the WBC-INCO.NET project and input from beneficiary countries.

The Platform welcomed the presentation made on survey on the research and innovation agenda in the region presented by the Institute of Economics in Zagreb. In this context, the importance of collecting data and establishing statistics and indicators was underlined. The Platform also welcomed the opportunity and ideas presented to enhance innovation and took note of the progress made on innovation by the WBC-INCO.NET work package on innovation. Mapping of innovation infrastructures was considered a useful exercise to build upon innovation capacity.


Steering Platform in context





Joint Action Plan

- August 2007 Publication of the "White Paper on overlaps, gaps and opportunities in view of the extension of bilateral RTD programmes and initiatives towards multilateral approaches" and its accompanying Joint Action Plan (JAP)
- widely distributed feedback/recommendations
- Second revision now in August 2009
- White Paper is designed as a policy paper, the JAP has to be understood as a working paper reflecting the current situation and proposing respective actual measures, gaining momentum through the combination, coordination and adaptation of the individual measures.

Joint Action Plan – amendments and updates

- Collaborative Research Projects: SEE-ERA.NET PLUS Call, Regional Technology Platforms
- Innovation: WBC-INCO.NET enhanced, future ERA-NET

- Institution building: NCP system, benchmarking and evaluation, science-industry networks, regional strategy on R&D for innovation, participation in ERA governance

9th Steering Platform Meeting: Conclusions

The Steering Platform on Research for the Western Balkan Countries met in Bečici, Montenegro on November 11, 2010. The meeting was co-chained by the Belgian Presidency of the Council of the European Union, Montenegro on behalf of the Western Balkan countries – which hosted the event – and the European Commission.

The Steering Platform heard the introductory statements from Montanegro, the Balgian Presidency and the European Commission, highlighting the recent policy actions taken at EU and regional level and notably on the proposed innovation Union and the impact this will have on future activities in research ecoperation already now in the upcoming FP7 calls and certainly in FP8. Platform members asked how actions in support to facilitating integration in the European Research Area and in particular on research capacity building, such as the Research Potential programme, will be addressed in the future. in this contact, it was recalled how important it is for the scientific community and innovation actors from the Balkan region to have specific actions in the Research Potential programme within FP7. The Platform took note of this request. As to FP8, the WBCs announced a contribution to the FP8 consuitation process which is to be welcomed. The Steering Platform welcomed the progress noted on the research chapter in the "enlargement package" adopted by the Commission. The package also showed the overall progress. made towards future integration into the EU.

The presentations of the Progress reports showed that both the Balkan countries and the other Platform members were satively promoting research cooperation under PFT, which is very much to be welcomed, and indeed necessary in order to increase participation and strengthen research capacity. Several actions had also been taken to incellitate thate integration in the European Research Area. This was also demonstrated by the activities of DOST and EUREKA. With respect to regional cooperation, the Platform finite winto of the further progress amounted by the ROC on the Continued on page 2

- ✓ Mutual learning: stocktaking and exchange, development of common positions, exchange of good practice, benchmarking activities (e.g. NCP systems), exchange of information (e.g. statistics, research information systems, etc.), trainings (e.g. innovation support measures, financial issues, etc.), brokerage events (in cooperation with EU-level projects, mainly NCP projects) -> implemented in projects!

Some further lessons learnt

Success

- widespread support, political commitment
- driving forces in the European Commission, Member States and target countries
- agreed common priorities and objectives
- outreach on different levels in particular to the researcher level
- clear benefits for all parties

Challenges

- general timing, delays etc.
- coordination / communication (lack of / too much)
- many stakeholders with different geographical foci
- changing personnel, individual motivation
- "red tape" at the related institutions
- repetitions
- "project rules and regulations" stifling some processes
