

Excellence in marine and maritime research, and in particular improved integration between all the relevant scientific disciplines, are needed to address complex sea-related issues in the framework of the EU maritime policy. This is an essential objective of the Communication A European Strategy for Marine and Maritime Research (COM (2008) 534), adopted in September 2008, which suggested, among other actions, to launch joint calls under FP7 in 2009–2010 on major research topics requiring a cross-thematic approach. The ocean of tomorrow call, which will be launched on 30th of July 2009, is a first Commission initiative to implement this commitment

THE OCEAN OF TOMORROW, THE CALL AT A GLANCE

The objective of the call is to build the knowledge base for a sustainable growth of sea-based activities. It will do this in two ways: by improving understanding of marine ecosystems' response to a combination of natural and anthropogenic factors; and by providing a scientific foundation for feasible, sustainable management measures supporting policies and possible related technologies.

The call will be implemented through three topics*:

- Quantification of climate change impacts on economics sectors in the Arctic. (11 milllion €)**
- Vectors of changes in marine life, impact on economic sectors. (12.5 million €) **
- Sub-seabed carbon storage and the marine environment. (10.5 million €)**

WHAT IS THE AIM OF THE INFO DAY?

WHAT WILL HAPPEN ON THE DAY?

To underline the relevance of the subject and the importance of the joint effort among different FP7 Themes, the event will be opened by two European Commissioners, Janez Potočnik, Commissioner for Science and Research and Joe Borg, Commissioner for Fisheries and Maritime Affairs.

The morning session will continue with a general presentation of the rationale for this call, its modalities for implementation, and the presentation of the three topics.

A panel of Commission representatives will then answer questions from participants on how they can best address the integration and multidisciplinary features of the call.

During the afternoon there will be a brokerage event. Participants are invited to give a "flash" 3-min. presentation (5 slides max). This should be related to a project idea, to their competence in the specific field, or to their interest in starting or joining a consortium.

The event will close with a Q&A session and final remarks from the Commission representatives.
